After Easter, we are amending our reflect and rebuild sessions. We are introducing these changes so you can support your child and the school in following our culture for learning policy.

A reflect and rebuild detention will be issued for pupils not adhering to the school's culture for learning. Any reflect and rebuild detentions given are reported to you at the end of the day via the <u>Classcharts App</u> and the detention will take place the following day. Pupils will be asked to stay behind at the end of day from 30 minutes to 1 hour depending on the frequency/severity of their behaviour. These sessions start at 3pm. This advance notification will allow you to organise transport for your child to make their way home from their reflect and rebuild detention the next day.

## REFLECT AND REBUILD CHANGES



From Monday, 17th April we will be amending the timing of the reflect and rebuild detentions as follows:

### **Amber detention**

A restorative meeting with the member of staff or a 30 minute detention

#### **Red detention**

45 minutes

**Multiple incidents** 


1 hour

Failure to attend detentions during the week: Internal exclusion until 4pm on the following Monday

In order to receive notification of the detention, you must be using the <u>ClassCharts</u> Parents App. This system allows us to securely share information for your benefit, e.g. timetable, achievements and rewards, attendance, real time behaviour and the reflect and rebuild detentions.

#### **Access to Classcharts**

- Check <u>Classcharts App</u> is on your mobile phone (downloadable from Google Play or App Store. You can also access it via the web).
- If you have <u>Classcharts</u>, but forgotten how to login please use the 'forgotten password' link.
- If you have never used <u>Classcharts</u>, please download the App and contact the school for your login details. We will also send you these the end of this term.
- Should you require any further information, please contact your child's Learning Family tutor.

e.g. jbloggs21




The books on MyOn are vibrant and engaging but also slightly shorter in length than ePlatform. Every book is also an audiobook, so you can listen along as you read!


Each students' username is their first initial, surname and the year they started. e.g. jbloggs21

# SUPPORT OUR SCHOOL

Please could we ask for your support in the following areas after the Easter break:

#### **MOBILE PHONES**

These are not permitted to be used during the school day. If students are seen with their phone between 8am and 4pm, they will be confiscated and kept in a safe location until the end of the day, when they can be collected. To support the school in managing this, please could we ask that you do not contact your child during the day on their mobile phone. In the case of an emergency where you may want to contact your child urgently, please contact our reception team who will be more than happy to facilitate calls and will pass on a message

accordingly.

#### **ATTENDANCE**

In order for pupils to perform their best academically, it is essential that they aim for their attendance to be at least 95%. Pupils who do not attend school frequently may fall behind with their work and be less likely to do well in their exams and assessments. In addition, those pupils who do not attend school for more than 5 days are at risk of a Fixed Penalty Fine from the Education Welfare Service. We offer a variety of support and guidance if you are experiencing difficulties in getting your child to school, please contact your child's Learning Family Tutor or House Team for further support.

#### **UNIFORM**

We encourage all of our pupils to be proud of their school and our uniform represents our school identity and House structure.
